BCHMO BOD Meeting April 17th, 2024 @ 9:35 A.M. Denny's Restaurant, Rolla, MO

1. CALL TO ORDER (Becki Krueger)

- A. Welcome

- 2. APPROVAL OF JANUARY 10TH, 2024 MINUTES with a few corrections. Lynette motioned to accept, Gary 2nd and all approved.

3. OFFICER REPORTS

- A. Chairman (Becki Krueger) Becki advised Cuivre River has been revived and is represented today by Jill Szczuka director and Kay Raterman, the alternate. The Chapter has 39 paid members to date and expects to rise to 46 in total memberships. Jill reported the lack of interest in the chapter was due to a previous park employee having a falling out with the Equestrian group as well the membership aging out. They are off to a great start with a new park official Alice Johnson, Park Site Supervisor. Introductions were made around the room so everyone knows the faces of the other Chapters.
 - Motion was made by Sherry, Lynette 2nd to reinstate all Chapter rights for the Cuivre River Chapter and all approved.
- A. Vice Chairman (Jennifer Wolf) none
- B. Secretary (Kathy Jaeger) Kathy thanked everyone for support attending the National Directors board mtg. Very informative and reaffirmed what a great organization this is.
- C. Treasurer (Julie Irwin) Julie had sent out financial reports to everyone. Presently income thru Feb 29, 2024 is \$2,058.79 with \$852 in a separate pay pal account. National Directors board meeting expenses were a little less than budgeted. Julie asked if \$500 chapter funds need to be set up for Cuivre River? Not needed at this time. Jill advised Chapter is working very well with the park and they have offered tool usage as well as members willing to donate to cover expenses. Becki reminded Julie she can reimburse up to \$100 for any one chapter's receipts presented for related expenses (per year).

Julie brought up an idea from Ray to have a point of sale item on our web page to see small items. There would be no cost to add this feature. It would simplify ordering in bulk. Julie motioned for it to be added, 2^{nd} by Gary and was approved.

Julie asked about insurance – there is insurance for the directors thru Travelers Insurance believes it comes due in June approximate cost of \$950. No liability insurance for individuals but the Corp of Engineers, USFS & National Parks have a form 301A & B which is completed for organized events by each participant and the Missouri State Parks have a similar separate form for their organized events that does cover liability during that event. Julie had checked on a General Liability policy and received an estimated cost of \$1,200 a year. With funds available at this time and operating under an estimated loss for this year, this discussion ceased with no further action.

Julie mentioned restricted funds of \$254 for NEMO/ \$2,645.10 for Rockwoods (some rolled from last year and some added this year). Sherry questioned where these restricted funds are shown on the financial reports.

Maury mentioned a restricted funds amount of approximately \$150 for Larry Hill's passing, a member of the South Central Chapter as well.

Motion made to accept Treasurer reports by Sherry, 2nd by Kathy and motion was approved.

4. STANDING AND AD HOC COMMITTEES

A. Education and Expansion (Becki Krueger) – Becki reported the Corp of Engineers are hosting a Youth event for 4-5 grades on April 26 for Earth Day at the Frank Russell Campground on Mark Twain Lake and she will

introduce the Light on the Land program to them. This will be a great time to introduce some "city" kids to the outdoors and to actually touch a live horse.

Becki has also been asked to participate in the Partnership Prospect Course. The Corp of Engineers St. Louis District will be hosting this course on how to set up working relationships with organizations such as Corp of Engineers, contractors and engineers from across the nation. They are expecting over 100 attendees.

- B. Publications (Cristlyn Randazzo)
 - a. Newsletter April 30th is deadline for Articles in the first newsletter. Lynette asked if this will be a quarterly publication? Becki advised not sure at this time. Cristlyn and Tabitha are working with Paula & Phyllis. Please submit articles for inclusion. Also if each Chapter could please send Cristlyn the general area your Chapter covers, it would help tremendously.
- C. Public Lands (Bob Wolf and Maury Mertz) Maury reported:
 - a. Green Trash Bags (up to 300 for USFS) Ed Sherman had requested the bags for Trail Crews and he thanked those of you who brought about 150 bags today.
 - b. SAM/UEI number USFS process is complete but we are still working on the others. The numbers are necessary to get paid and/or reimbursed for coordinated work.
 There is a Trails Skill event in May at Brushy Creek and he advised he believes they already have a waiting list at this time. Lynette advised she had one individual interested for Chainsaw cert. Maury advised her to give him the name. Two new parks being worked on are the Bryant Creek and the Eleven Point. Back Country Horsemen and the public need to be sure and complete the online survey to request trails be included in this initial planning process.
- D. Service (Ray Maynard) Becki encouraged everyone to report your Volunteer Hours as this is the way we show our value to the Public Lands managers. There were 34 horses show up for the cleanup at the Upper Current River area this spring alone. This was a great turn out moving logs off trails and getting many bags of trash picked up. The recent changes to the Proposed Road and Trail details in the ONSR area are still waiting on the Environmental Impact study and we will keep you posted. Jill commented on the huge impact that a recent Thank You Letter from Maury had made in her area. It opened many doors to getting them started again and shows just what contribution the Back Country Horseman can have in our public lands.
 - a. IIP requests? None have been submitted to date.
- E. National Directors (Becki Krueger and Kathy Jaeger) Becki reported at the BCHA National Board meeting, the emphasis on our Public Lands and Membership. Youth is very important to get them involved and Jill advised they have a JR program already in the works. With regards to Public Lands, Becki advised she is on a monthly call with National Directors to discuss issues and upcoming changes and would like to see us do something similar statewide here in Missouri. Proposed to set up a State level committee to keep in touch on our issues. The BCHA membership dues increase of \$5 each category was voted on and did pass. It will take effect on January 1, 2025 and be paid in February of 2026. Becki will get with Ray to get it publicized on the Web Page.
 - a. Light on the Land everyone needs to promote this program within our Chapters and the public. A copy of the details are available on the BCHA web site.

- D. Merchandise purchase (Maury Mertz) (48 hats) Maury reported we need to think of reordering the ball caps. Last purchase was minimum of 48 and cost \$11 each. We sell for \$15 each. Kathy to check with a local company in Rolla for pricing so this action is tabled at this time.

Discussion took place on setting the next year's date for the Annual Membership meeting so we would not have to keep moving the date around.
